# About Potential Kids

## POTENTIAL Kids

Potential Kids offer after school and weekend activity sessions for young people with special educational needs and disabilities. The sessions are kept small enough in numbers to reduce social anxieties and fears. They are held in safe environments where young people can be understood, accepted and have the opportunity of meeting others like themselves. They are able to learn and develop their social and communication skills through play with others. Most who attend will have limited opportunities to socialise, learn and have fun, as they may have been unable to join other mainstream classes.

Potential Kids offers an avenue for young people to reduce their social isolation, increase their self esteem whilst also building their self-confidence. The groups give parents the opportunity to have a coffee and some down time whilst their children socialise, learn and play.

This non-profit organisation was set up by Angela Gaughan, a mother of a child on the autistic spectrum.

Potential Kids achieved ARISE funding to help with the set up costs of the charity. However, establishing an operating base for Potential Kids was highly challenging with the group initially suffering breaks-ins, vandalism and premises leasing issues. Fortunately, Angela's dedication and a strong relationship with The Galleria team meant that Potential Kids were able to relocate and are now securely based within The Galleria.





Unless stated, sessions must be attended at all times by a responsible parent/carer aged over 18 years and they must remain on the premises.

### Local primary schools, partner with The Galleria for World Environment Day

The Galleria hosted children, from Ryde and St Philip Howard primary schools, on Wednesday 5th June to celebrate World Environment Day with a range of interactive environment focused activities.

Staff at The Galleria were assisted by representatives from the World Wildlife Trust, who accompanied the group on a tour of The Galleria's gardens teaching them about biodiversity in the local area and helping the children to identify different types of bugs. As part of the tour, the children learned about the ways in which The Galleria is supporting the local environment, including visiting the bird boxes and lavender garden on site and learning about the centres recycling efforts. The day concluded with the children taking part in a wildlife quiz, games and planting sunflower seeds to take home.

## Purple Tuesday

### 12th November 2019

#### What is Purple Tuesday?

Purple Tuesday was introduced last year as the UK's first accessible shopping day, established to recognise the importance and needs of disabled consumers, raise awareness of the value of the Purple Pound, and promote inclusive shopping. This year it will be held on the 12th November and this is an opportunity for all organisations across all sectors to improve their customer experience for disabled people.

## The Galleria is proud to support Purple Tuesday and have helped our disabled customers by:

- Installing new signage to promote awareness of hidden disabilities through the adoption of the "Not every disability is visible"
- Introducing a quiet hour every Sunday from 11am to 12pm for people with autism as well as other sensory needs
- Launching a dedicated space to support autistic people and their families who often find shopping difficult due to sensory difficulties. The room aims to provide a safe and calm environment where autistic people can take time out as well as those with learning difficulties and sensory conditions
- Training key members of staff to identify, support and respond effectively to autistic visitors of all ages
- Installing a hearing loop at customer services
- Achieving Level 1 of the Government's Disability Confident accreditation
- Hidden Disability lanyards available for customers that require additional assistance throughout our stores, restaurants and in general, as they enjoy a day out in the centre

This Purple Tuesday we will be highlighting to our guests the importance of the disabled customer to provide practical ways to improve their experience by:

- The opportunity to purchase Purple merchandise such as pin badges from our customer services desk to show your support
- Reminding all customer facing staff why Purple Tuesday is so important
- Installing posters advertising the Disability Services available in the centre
- Dedicating staff to take part in a mental health first aid course
- Making improvements to our website accessibility for our disabled users
- Working with brand partners to review their stores disability access
